World AIDS Day is observed on December 1st every year to raise awareness about HIV and AIDS, and to show support for people living with HIV. The theme for 2024 is "Take the Rights Path: My Health, My Right!"

Here are some ways to prevent the spread of HIV:

- Use condoms: Use a male or female condom correctly every time you have sex, especially
 with partners whose HIV status is unknown or who are HIV positive. Don't use condoms
 made from animal products.
- Take PrEP: If you don't have HIV but are at risk of getting it, you can take pre-exposure
 prophylaxis (PrEP). PrEP involves taking a specific HIV medicine every day or an
 injectable HIV medicine every two months.
- Take PEP: If you think you've been exposed to HIV, you should contact your healthcare
 provider as soon as possible to see if you should take post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP).
- Get tested: Get tested for HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs).
- Don't share needles: Never share needles to take drugs. If you do inject drugs, use only
 sterile injection equipment and water. You can get new needles and syringes and safely
 dispose of used at syringe services programs (SSPs).
- Avoid getting drunk or high: Intoxicated people might be less likely to protect themselves.
- Take HIV medicine: If you have HIV, take HIV medicine (called antiretroviral therapy or ART) as prescribed by your doctor.
- Get circumcised: Consider getting a voluntary medical male circumcision.
